- Approximately 130 Elsevier journals are now only available online and are linked in the iLink catalog. Remote access is via proxy server.
- Approximately 170 IEEE journals are now only available online and are linked in the iLink catalog. Remote access is via proxy server.
- Almost all journals that are available online, particularly via EbscoHost, JSTOR, Lexis Nexis and other full text vendors are indicated in the catalog with a link.

- ABC-CLIO history journals are now linked with the full-text providers JSTOR and Ingenta.

### **General Highlights**

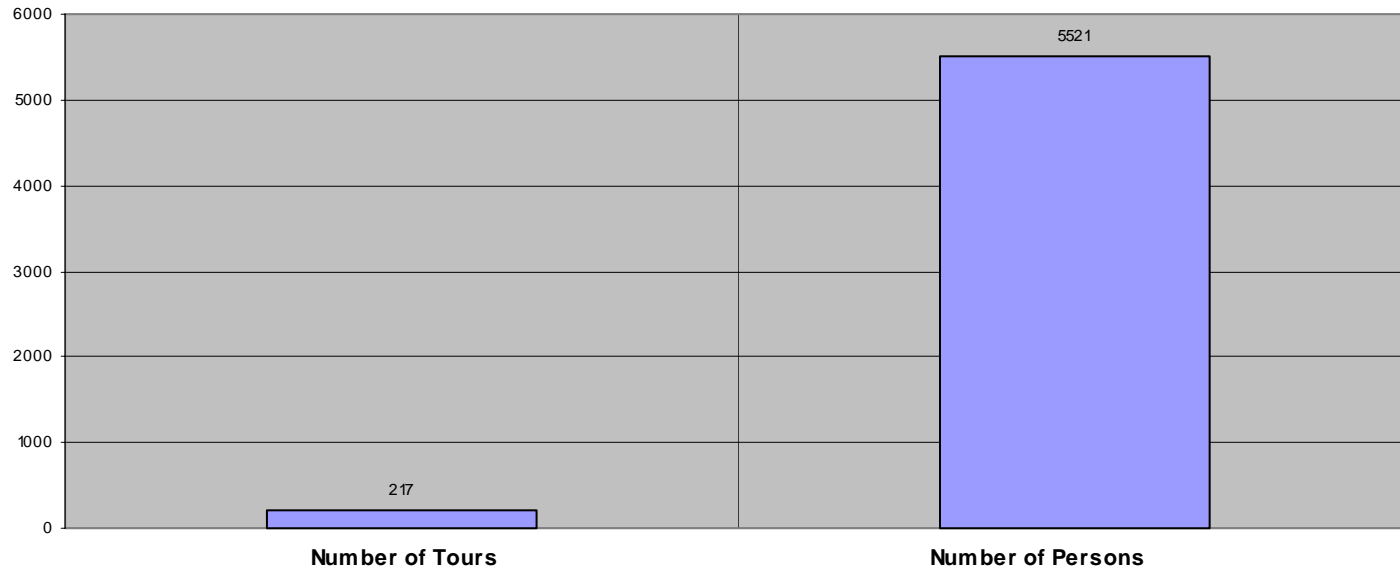
- STEP Grant awarded to fund upgrades of computers in Bib Lab and ROC. Amount funded: \$36,834.00.
- Ashley Bonnette away for Spring Semester to attend Semester at Sea program.
- Martin Cooperson, SLIS student, was an Intern for BI and Reference as a SLIS Field Experience 7904 student.
- Sherry conducted the ENGL 305 course for four students.
- Distance Learning Technology Committee organized to support DL measures; the library will participate in their efforts.
- Staffing for instructional tours continued to be a challenge due to limited number of library staff available for classes. To achieve the highest level of bibliographic instruction services, alternative methods of instruction should be considered and additional staff must be provided, whether they are graduate students or full-time library employees.
- Proxy server installed to provide users remote access to library databases.
- Library web site converted to reflect University's new web site template. Thanks to Susan Richard who completed much of the project while Sherry was on maternity leave. Over 237 web pages were converted.
- Control of library web site returned by UCSS in early January. Control given to separate departments including Reference and Special Collections.

### **Software highlights:**

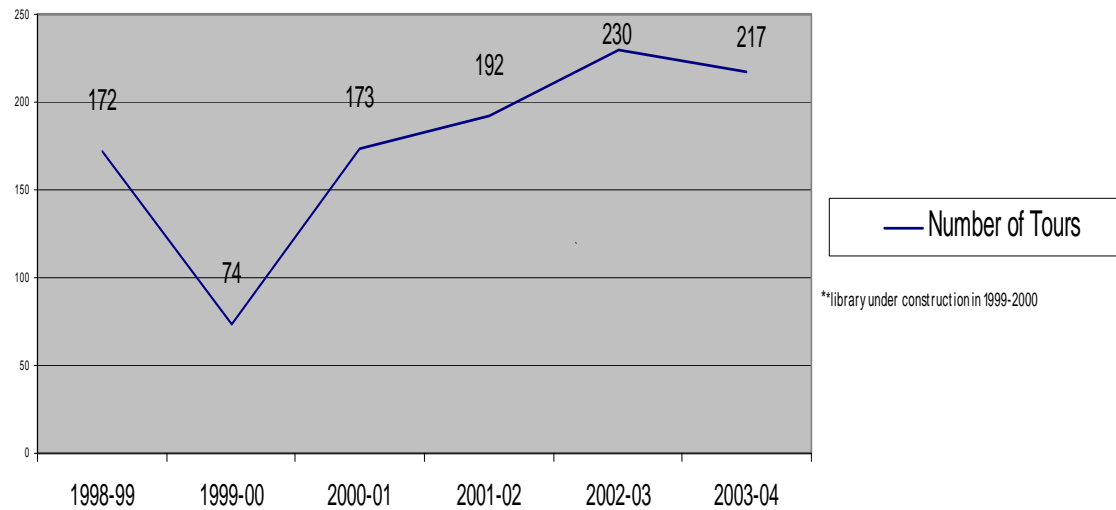
- Macromedia Dreamweaver MX was installed in several depts. to assist with web page design and maintenance; this followed a two week mandatory workshop by UCSS for recipients. Sherry and Susan also had related graphics software Fireworks installed.
- Adobe Acrobat 6.9 installed to convert documents more easily and efficiently.
- Star Office 7, a free, rudimentary pdf and editing program from UCSS and Sun, installed on several computers.
- MS Office upgrades and Globalscape Cute FTP installed on new computers in Internet Access Services.
- Kiosk project terminated due to lack of computer stability, security and funding for site visits.
- Bib Lab used as temporary housing for University College summer 2004. Library expects Bib Lab control returned by Fall 2004 semester.



### 2003-2004 Fiscal Year Total



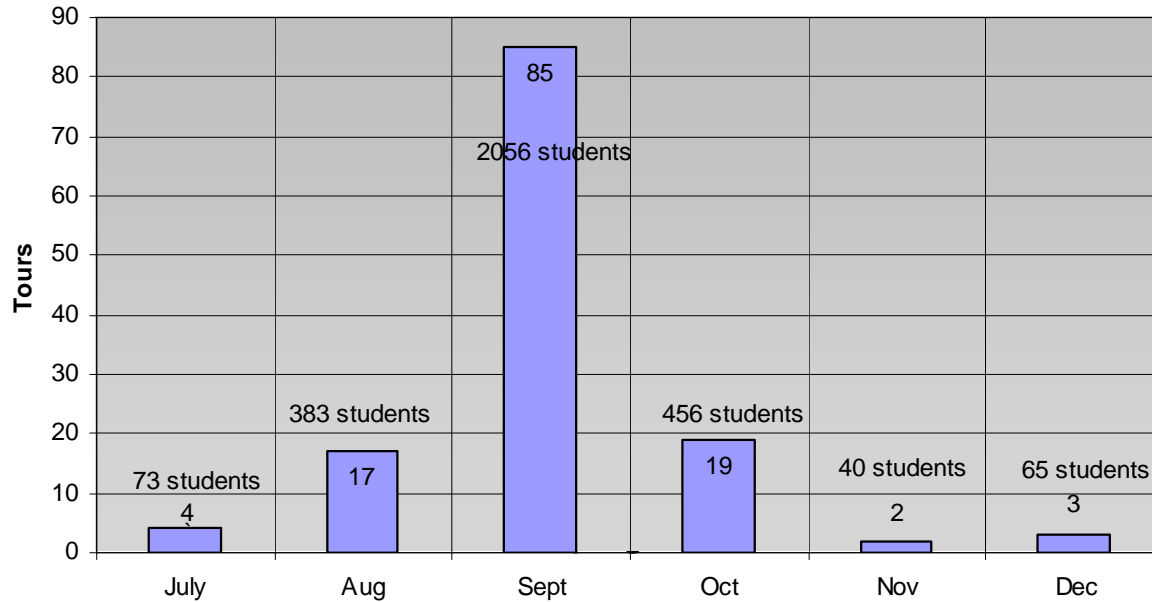

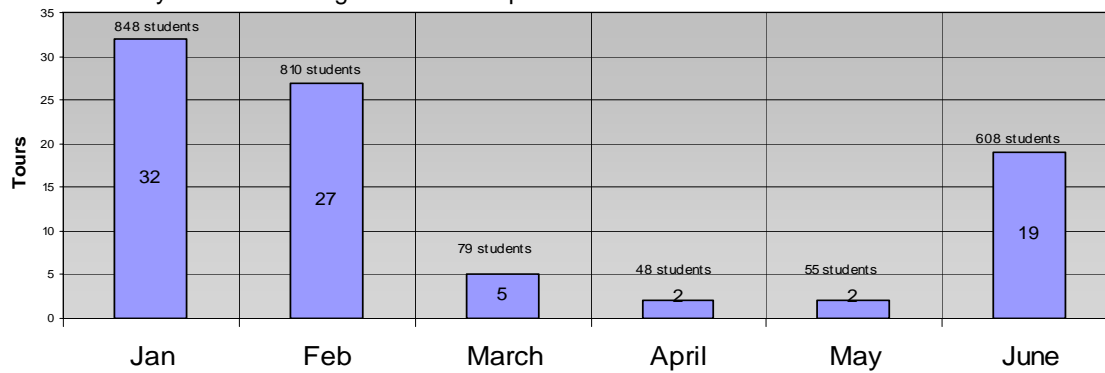
